The Neighbourhood Care Scheme (NCS) is an award-winning befriending service provided by Impetus, the Brighton and Hove charity that addresses the problems of isolation and loneliness. We match volunteers with people who are isolated as a result of age, physical or sensory disabilities and caring responsibilities.

Loneliness and isolation make us more prone to depression and can be as damaging to our health as smoking 15 cigarettes a day. As Kathleen says, an hour or two a week in the company of an NCS volunteer visitor can have a huge impact on someone's health and sense of wellbeing.

We have lots of people waiting and hoping for some friendly company locally. With just an hour or so each week you could make a big difference to someone's life.

MLAT Reps update on HMO's.

An HMO is a House of Multiple Occupation. The MLAT have reps on the Lewes Road corridor HMO Action Group as it is of concern to residents in the area and has been raised in our Residents Priorities.

The council now condition the layout and number of people in all HMO permissions. So if permission is granted for a maximum of four people in an HMO, another planning application will be needed for more than four people to live there.

All properties in the area licensed as HMOs for the first time since the beginning of 2016 are being investigated. This is resulting in more planning applications and enforcement notices.

The group meet regularly and have fed back on several HMO's in the area which have been refused planning permission which means they **must** return back to family accommodation and this will be enforced by the council. An example of this is 25 Wheatfield Way. Residents feel that something is being done at last!

Since November 2016, seven new enforcement notices across Moulsecoomb, Bevendean and Coldean have been issued ordering the properties to stop being used as an HMO.
